The Localism Bill will give parish councils powers to shape their community through a 'Neighbourhood Plan'. Key to creating this local vision, is a need for our community to express their views on the area, thus shaping future development and our Council Tax precept.

Great Boughton and Huntington Parish Council supported by Cheshire West & Chester Council will start this process with a public meeting held at Bishops' High School.

Cheshire West & Chester are one of only 17 Councils throughout the UK to trial the new scheme which will give local people a stronger voice in deciding the look and feel of future development of their Communities.

The Neighbourhood Plans will be prepared by 'qualifying bodies', which are Parish or Town Councils, in conjunction with local groups and the wider community.

Everyone will then be asked to vote for or against the proposals in a local Referendum and if the majority are in favour, the local authority must bring order into effect or adopt the plan. Adopted plans will then become part of the statutory 'Development Plan' and therefore shape the Community in the future .

Your attendance on the 19th Sept will become an essential part of the first key stage of this process and all members of the Parish Council welcome your attendance.
